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

### SCHEDULE

All competitors must have a current CMP Talladega Marksmanship Park Range Safety Card on them to compete in the match. If you do not have a current Range Safety Card you will have to watch the video and complete the CMP Marksmanship Park waiver in the clubhouse before going to the match.

Registration for the 2Gun Nationals will be in the CMP Clubhouse.

Competitors need to report to their first stage prior to the start of first shots at 9:00am, but not before coming to the CMP Marksmanship Park clubhouse first to:

### USPSA 2GUN NATIONALS MATCH BRIEFING

**SAFETY AREAS:** Safe areas are provided for your use and there will be no gun handling of pistols at your vehicle. PCC's may be transferred safely from your automobile to carts as needed. You must have a chamber flag and it must be inserted prior to arriving at the range. The chamber flag must be inserted before shooting, and between stages. You may not sweep any person with the muzzle of a firearm at any time for any reason.

#### CARTS, BUGGIES AND ATV'S

PCC's are to be carried vertically muzzle up or down in a cart, buggy or ATV (conveyance) with a chamber flag inserted. If your PCC's are carried horizontally (laying on a red wagon for example) they must to be bagged. Most common practices are muzzle up in the back of a UTV/ATV or muzzle down at 45 degrees on a baby jogging stroller. If your PCC is racked in a motorized vehicle, you MAY remove your flagged PCC keeping the muzzle in whatever direction it's in (up or down) and proceed to the stage or to the staging area at your discretion. Same for replacing it. You do not need to be close to a berm to take these actions provided your muzzle stays in the same orientation the whole time. If your PCC is in a case, scabbard, or bag, or on a cart, you must uncase or uncart the PCC into a berm, without sweeping yourself or someone else. Please be as close to the berm as practical when doing so. The rules state within 6 feet.

#### **COMING TO THE LINE:**

In the interest of match flow we want the on-deck shooter to be as ready as possible. You MAY bring your gun(s) to the start position without RO direction when you are on deck. You may not stage them in a barrel, or on a table, or anything. You may bring your PCC to the line, flagged, muzzle up or down and wait for the Make Ready command. Example: PCC/Pistol stage as they are nearing the end of scoring you can and should be at the starting position with your unloaded pistol holstered and your flagged PCC muzzle up or down awaiting commands. This includes bringing said PCC off of your conveyance without direct supervision or direction.

- 10.5.4.3 Bottom line, you may not sweep any person with the muzzle of a firearm at any time for any reason. Loaded, unloaded, flagged, not flagged. Common sense gun handling and also a rule.
- The match is a two-day format with 11 courses of fire. There are AM/PM or PM/AM. The range will be on two zones.
- The match is under USPSA Multigun Rules, the scoring is Time Plus. Please review the Multgun Rulebook.
- Time Plus is two anywhere or one alpha to neutralize the target. Total time to shoot the stage plus penalties

This is a USPSA Match being ran under the USPSA Multgun Rules. Click here for full rules.

- There is no major or minor, there is no chrono, but there will be falling steel.
- Stage WSB has minimum round count, which is considered one alpha. You should plan your ammunition consumption accordingly i.e. two on paper to neutralize for example. There are 189 cardboard targets, 91 pieces of steel & 27 clay targets. (Approx 250 handgun, 250 PCC)
- Steel targets, falling and static, are optional for either handgun or PCC. Frangible (clay birds) are PCC only targets
- USPSA cardboard are handgun only, IPSC cardboard are PCC
- Distance, the match will be on the Action Shooting Bays at the CMP and there will not be required shots over 75 yards.
- Your handgun will determine your division. If you have optics then you will be in Open Division, iron sights are Limited Division.
- The other features of the handgun are outlined in the appendixes of the rulebook, specifically magazine size restrictions, i.e. Your 47 round Glock magazines can't go in your handgun, you will shoot for no score if that happens.
- The stages will have you starting with only one of the firearms, PCC will be stock on belt, handgun will be loaded and holstered. The other firearm would then be staged.
- Transitions between firearms will have you "dumping" one for the other using MGM style of drop boxes.
- Slings will not be required
- Function fire bay will be located in the vendor/demo area and all gun handling rules apply
- Parking for all competitors shooting in zone 1 will be in the parking lot. Competitors shooting in zone 2 will be at the top of the hill.
- ATV/Carts are allowed but will be required to park at the end of the Bay areas.
- There will be Federal 150gr Syntech Action Pistol 9mm ammunition on site for purchase or ordering ahead for pickup.
- Please ensure your USPSA membership is current before arriving to the CMP Marksmanship Park. Everyone, competitors and visitors, are required to have a current CMP Safety Card on them while on the Action Bays. You will be able to get this before the match starts at the main CMP Clubhouse where match check-in will take place.

THESE POLICIES ARE JUST AS IMPORTANT **AS THE RULES.** YOU ARE EXPECTED TO READ AND UNDERSTAND ALL THE CONTENTS OF THIS MATCH PUBLICATION.

All competitors must have a current CMP Talladega Marksmanship Park Range Safety Card on them to compete in the match. If you do not have a current Range Safety Card you will have to watch the video and complete the CMP Marksmanship Park waiver in the clubhouse before going to the match. Registration for the SIG 2 Gun Nationals will be in the CMP Clubhouse. See Schedule for details.

Competitors need to report to their first stage prior to the start of first shots at 9:00am, but not before coming to the CMP Marksmanship Park clubhouse first to:

- Check in for the Match
- Ensure that they have a current CMP Marksmanship Park Range Safety Card

**COLD RANGE:** The CMP Marksmanship Park is a cold range. Firearms will not be handled anywhere on the range except in designated safety areas or under the direct supervision of match staff. Handling handguns in parking areas is unsafe gun handling. PCC's may be transferred safely from your automobile to carts as needed. Chamber flags are required and must be inserted prior to arriving at the range, and between stages. You may not sweep any person with the muzzle of a firearm at any time for any reason.

**SAFETY AREAS:** The range is equipped with a number of safety areas to bag and holster guns, for dry fire practice and gun repair, etc. No ammunition may be handled in any safety area.

**RULES:** The match rules are found in the current edition of the USPSA Multigun Competition Rules.

**OBEY YOUR RO'S:** Range officers are here to assist you in completing a safe shooting contest. Please comply with their requests. Please bring any issues to the attention of one of the Range Masters.

**SET STEEL AND TAPE TARGETS:** Competitors are expected to stay together as a squad to tape, set steel, and help maintain efficiency on each stage.

**LOST BRASS:** All brass is donated to the staff.

**ALCOHOL:** Alcohol and recreational drugs may not be consumed anywhere on the range. Competitors violating this policy will be disqualified and asked to leave the range.

**DRESSCODE:** Practical shooting is a sport. The match director will be the final arbiter of dubious taste.

**SCHEDULING:** No competitor will compete for score on other than the scheduled dates (6.5.1). Occasionally, stages will clear squads early. If your entire squad is available and the CRO approves, the squad will be allowed to shoot ahead of schedule, but only on the scheduled date.

**INSPECTION:** When the entire squad is assembled, the written stage briefing will be read. This will be followed by an inspection and question period. Shooters may negotiate obstacles only during this inspection period or while the previous shooter's targets are being scored. Early inspection is permitted by the squad next scheduled to shoot a stage, providing that the previous squad is finished, you report to the range officer prior to inspection, and time permits.

**RANGE OPENING:** The range is closed to all competitors prior to the scheduled start time of the staff match June 4th at 9:00am. Registration will open June 4th from 1:00pm to 6:00pm and June 5th from 7:30am till 1:00pm. There cannot be any shots fired until 9:00am. The range will close each day at 6:30pm.

Competitors may inspect the stages when they are available, but may not activate, set, or reset any moving targets or activated props. Competitors are not allowed to inspect the stages until the range has been opened. Competitors must have a current CMP Marksmanship Park Range Safety Card on them before being allowed to go on the range.

**HAZARD AREAS:** Orange cones and/or safety flagging may be used to restrict certain areas of the range. For safety reasons, competitors and spectators are prohibited from going past these markers without permission.

#### **EYE AND HEARING PROTECTION:**

All competitors and visitors must wear eye and hearing protection at all times while on the range. Eye protection is required to be worn by everyone while on the range. If you do not have adequate eye protection, please see the range master.

**MATCH SCORING:** The championship will use Practiscore. If you have scoring questions, contact the Range Master and Stats.







### USPSA 2GUN NATIONALS RANGE FACILITIES

All competitors must have a current CMP Talladega Marksmanship Park Range Safety Card on them to compete in the match. If you do not have a current Range Safety Card you will have to watch the video and complete the CMP Marksmanship Park waiver in the clubhouse before going to the match. Registration for the SIG 2 Gun Nationals will be in the CMP Clubhouse. See Schedule for details.

**REST ROOMS:** Portable toilets are located conveniently around the range.

**FOOD SERVICE:** Lunch will be available for purchase. Water will be provided on the bays.

**CLOSED RANGE:** If the range is marked closed, and a barrier is across the range road, no competitors may enter the range for any reason. We will have access to the bathrooms, registration, and ammo pickup available and clearly marked. Any competitor on a closed range will be required to leave and may be subject to disqualification. Please obey the signs.

**PARKING:** Parking areas will be clearly marked on the range map. Competitors may only park in the competitor areas. Lock your car and take your valuables.

**PERSONAL VEHICLES:** Personal vehicles (i.e. motorized golf cart/UTV etc) are allowed. The CMP is offering Golf Cart rentals for competitors and are allowed on the range. Carts and wagons are allowed. You must drive slowly and cautiously, and may not park anywhere but on the side of the range road, leaving clearance for staff vehicles at all times. Parking under the covers is not allowed. Failure to comply will result in vehicle privileges being revoked.



**SPECTATORS:** Everyone must wear ear and eye protection while on the range. Climbing on berms is not allowed. Children must be under the direct supervision of a parent. If you need eye protection, please see a range master.

**EXHIBITS/DEMO AREA:** The U.S. Nationals Exhibits, featuring many different suppliers to our sport, will be in the sponsor tent at the range. Only sponsors of the U.S. National Championships are allowed display areas on the range. Please acknowledge and thank them for their generous support.

**PRIZE TABLE/TROPHIES:** All trophies will be given out at the awards ceremony: Sunday June 6th. See schedule for times and location. Prizes will also be distributed after the awards ceremony. All prizes are distributed to competitors based on order of finish in each division.

**ELIGIBILITY:** The National Champion must be a U.S. citizen or a resident with a valid work permit (green card) and a current member of USPSA. Trophies/Plaques will be awarded based on the criteria in Appendix A2 of the current USPSA Multigun Rules. In a National Championship, there must be at least 10 competitors in a division and 5 in a category in that division for recognition. You must be a current USPSA member before the commencement of the match on June 4th in order to compete.

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


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

### STARTING POSITION:


Standing with toes on marks with wrists above respective shoulders, pistol loaded and holstered.


### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within shooting area.

TARGETS: 15 USPSA targets and 6 poppers (all pistol). 21 minimum

rounds.







### [STAGE 2] **TANGO**




### STARTING POSITION:

Hands on X marks, with pistol loaded and holstered. PCC is loaded and staged in either box.

### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within the shooting area. Firearm must be abandoned in dump box.

TARGETS: There are 12 USPSA targets (pistol), 9 IPSC targets (PCC) and 4 poppers (PCC or pistol). 25 minimum rounds.





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### [STAGE 3]

### **226**




### STARTING POSITION:

Standing in shooting area with heels on marks holding loaded PCC, stock on belt. Pistol is loaded and staged in dump bin.

### **STAGE PROCEDURE:**

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within shooting area. Popper activates swinger which remains visible. PCC must be abandoned in dump box.

TARGETS: There are 13 USPSA targets (pistol), 13 IPSC targets (PCC), 6 frangible (PCC), 4 poppers and 4 static steel (PCC or pistol). 40 minimum rounds.



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### [STAGE 4] **SCORPION**

#### STARTING POSITION:


Standing with heels on marks with either pistol loaded and holstered, with wrists below belt or holding loaded PCC, stock on belt. Other firearm is loaded and staged in dump box.



### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within shooting area. Firearm must be abandoned in dump box.

TARGETS: 12 USPSA targets (pistol), 12 IPSC targets (PCC), 8 frangible targets (PCC), and 7 static steel (PCC or pistol). 39 minimum rounds.







### [STAGE 5] **MPX**



### STARTING POSITION:


Seated in chair, *unloaded* PCC lying flat on table muzzle pointed generally downrange.

### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within shooting area. Poppers activates swingers which remain visible.

**TARGETS:** There are 10 IPSC targets and 10 poppers (all PCC).

20 minimum rounds.



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### [STAGE 6] **M17**

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### STARTING POSITION:


Standing completely outside shooting area, with toes touching either set of marks and wrists below belt, pistol is loaded and holstered.

#### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within shooting area.

TARGETS: There are 10 USPSA targets and 6 poppers (all pistol).

16 minimum rounds.







### [STAGE 7] XRAY




#### STARTING POSITION:


Standing in either box holding loaded PCC with stock on belt or with wrists above respective shoulders, pistol loaded and holstered. Other firearm is loaded and staged in dump box.

#### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within shooting areas. Firearm must be abandoned in dump box. Poppers activate the swingers which remain visible at rest.

**TARGETS:** There are 9 USPSA targets (pistol), 9 IPSC targets (PCC), 8 poppers and 6 static steel (PCC or pistol). 32 minimum rounds.







### [STAGE 8] COPPERHEAD




### STARTING POSITION:

Standing with toes on marks holding loaded PCC, stock on belt.

#### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within the shooting area. Poppers activate the swingers which remain visible.

**TARGETS:** There are 6 IPSC targets, 6 poppers, 5 static steel and 8 frangible targets (all PCC). 25 minimum rounds.



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### [STAGE 9] **V-CROWN**




#### STARTING POSITION:

Standing anywhere in shooting area with either pistol loaded and holstered, wrists below belt or holding loaded PCC with stock on belt. The other firearm is loaded and staged in dump box.

### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within the shooting area. Firearm must be abandoned in dump box. Popper activates the swinger which remains visible.

**TARGETS:** There are 9 USPSA targets (pistol), 8 IPSC targets (PCC), 2 poppers and 5 static steel (PCC or pistol). 24 minimum rounds.





[STAGE 10] WHISKEY stage sponsored by




### STARTING POSITION:

Standing anywhere in the shooting area, either holding loaded PCC with stock on belt or with pistol loaded and holstered, wrists below belt. The other firearm is loaded and staged in dump box.

### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within the shooting area. Firearm must be abandoned in dump box. Popper activates swinger which remains visible.

**TARGETS:** There are 11 USPSA targets (pistol), 11 IPSC targets (PCC), 5 frangible targets (PCC), 4 static steel and 4 poppers (PCC or pistol). 35 minimum rounds.





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### [STAGE 11] **320**

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
#### STARTING POSITION:

Standing completely outside shooting area with toes touching marks, holding loaded PCC with stock on belt. Loaded pistol is staged in dump box.

### STAGE PROCEDURE:

Upon audible start signal, engage targets from within shooting area. PCC must be abandoned in dump box. Poppers activate swingers which remain visible.

TARGETS: There are 10 USPSA targets (pistol), 10 IPSC targets (PCC), 3 poppers and 5 static steel (PCC or pistol). 28 minimum rounds.
